

Pastor Appreciation says more about your church than your pastor. Every church wants to be known as a loving church. One of the most obvious measures of a loving congregation is how they treat their pastor. Here are a few ideas that may be appropriate expressions of appreciation for your pastor, or they may spur your own imagination on to something even more personal.

- 1. Let your pastor(s) know that you support her/him/them, and that you pray for them daily/weekly. Then actually do it.
- 2. Apply the truth of your pastor's preaching to specific areas of your life and then say, "Thank You Pastor, for helping me spiritually."
- 3. Practice Extravagant Generosity with words of encouragement to your pastor(s) for their service to God and your congregation.
- 4. Engage in **Radical Hospitality** by inviting your pastoral family to your next social time with friends or family.
- 5. Get involved in *Risk-taking Mission and Service* by baby-sitting for your pastor's children, allowing your pastor and their spouse time for a date.
- 6. Gift cards for restaurants, book stores (Amazon-Kindle, iTunes, Barnes and Noble-Nook), movies, etc., are always appreciated.
- 7. Organize a small group to care for mowing at the parsonage for one month. This would be particularly appreciated during periods of extra meetings or events.
- 8. Offer to care for snow removal of the parsonage driveway the first heavy snow of the winter, or maybe the week before and after Christmas.
- 9. Bring invited guests with you to worship each Sunday during October.
- 10. Be present at worship each Sunday during October.
- 11. Volunteer several hours at your local shelter, food bank or youth center in honor of your pastor or local church.
- 12. Give altar flowers in honor of your pastor or pastoral family.

- 13. Some congregations accept money during the month of October and present it to their pastor toward the end of October as an "Appreciation Offering".
- 14. Donate generously to your local food bank or Advance Special in honor of your pastor.
- 15. Organize a "pounding" or "pound party". A "pound party" is an event where each person brings something as a gift, usually that weights about a pound, such as a pound of sugar, a pound of beef, a pound of flour, etc.. This type of event is particularly a blessing for the pastor who is part-time and/or without insurance.
