I heard her say with the utmost care and patience to the little girl who was about 3 stairs behind a little boy, "Now Annie, let's give Tommy his space, as he is walking downstairs, so he has all the room he needs." (not their real names) Later, Tami explained that this young boy has anxiety when going down the steps about people being too close behind him. I saw how much care went into letting this young little boy navigate the steps in a way that helped him feel comfortable, and not filled with shame or worry for

going too slow. He was given what he needed to be himself. I saw so much beauty and grace in this action. We all need space to be who we are in an authentic and real way. I am



sure there are many, many such moments as this one. I have seen them.
