

BIBLE STUDY STARTING MONDAY SEPTEMBER 9TH AT 9:30 A.M.

Whether you have read the novel, seen the Broadway musical, heard its soundtrack, or seen the screen adaptations, you already know the power of Les Miserables. In this 8 week study, author and pastor Matt Rawle explores six themes – grace, justice, poverty, revolution, love and hope – each represented by a character in Hugo's story. Rawle draws parallels between the iconic story and musical and our Christian calling, inspiring us to understand our faith and live it out in the world.

Matt Rawle's passion for musical theater and scripture has led him to create an insightful spiritual exploration of Victor Hugo's Les Miserables. Rawle connects the spiritual journeys of the main characters to the Gospels while also sharing from his life as a pastor, parent, student and actor. —taken from John O'Boyle, Broadway producer and composer




